WHY PIÑONES?

Piñones: The Island Within an Island



It is important to take care of one another in times of need



It is diffcult for Emergency vehicles to access Piñones via the single two-lane road

• Delayed response times & evacuations

Piñones was among the last areas to receive power after both Hurricane Maria and the recent 4/6 power outage

• Restricts communication

Preparation is key!

CONNECTING WITH THE COMMUNITY

Data Collection

- 1. Shawn introduces group and explains BARA GUABEL program
- 2. They allow the team onto their property to discuss details
- 3. Conversation is opened up to the IQP group members and Shawn translates information between the two parties
- 4. Resident volunteers their information for the technical mapping system



Self-Sufficiency

- Residents on their porch preparing to cook crabs
- Invited into the backyard papayas and pigs
- Evidence of **self-sufficiency** and knowledge of the land
- Agreed to take part in BARA GUABEL



Local Challenges

- Conversation with 100+ year old resident and his younger female relative
- Born before Puerto Rico had a registry - does not know his true age
- Difficulties acquiring food stamps
- Used local vegetation as medicine



- The woman's goal was to open up a gas station in Pinones
- Receptive to participating in BARA GUABEL
- Volunteered their information to the technical mapping database

Discouraging Past Experiences

- This lady demonstrated an inviting reaction at first
- Her neighboring relative overheard the conversation and came out to join in
- Told the group that neither of them were interested in continuing the conversation



Conversations with Shawn Halliburton

• It was not until the industrialization of Puerto Rico that the land started to become unrecognizable to the residents.

 In the late 40's, the Loíza residents were a large part of the labor force that built the modern infrastructure of Metro San Juan. From 1950-2000, the community watched as their way of life was annihilated.


• When Piñones residents reach out for help, they receive little support from the government, who had promised them that industrialization would benefit them.

TECHNICAL MAPPING SYSTEM

Mapping Tool

- Centralizes survey data
- Click on a blue pin to see information pertaining to that specific community member

• Linked to survey and excel sheet in shared google drive account



Mapping Tool Database Findings


Examples

- 75% of surveyed households own a generator
- Surveyed community members report a wide variety of technical skills throughout the neighborhood
- 72% of surveyed community members report to have access to a vehicle

What does this mean?

The community posses skills and resources to increase resiliency.


Giomar Cruz


FUTURE OF THE PROGRAM

- Develop a method to regularly update the community on BARA GUABEL's progress
- Work with the community center non-profit groups to create a centralized platform to promote their causes
- Request a space at the community center and stock it with emergency supplies

Replace gas powered generators with solar powered ones
