Volunteer Information

This section describes the volunteer categories and the expectations of each volunteer role.

- Standard Volunteers
 - o Misc.
 - Volunteer Positions that are TBD to help with event flow.
 - o A/V Crew
 - In charge of lighting and audio/video for challenge venues
 - o Challenge Reset
 - Assists in challenge venue maintenance
 - Queuing
 - Maintains time flow of each challenge by directing teams to necessary destinations
 - o Referee
 - Assists in upholding event challenge rules
 - Challenge Admin
 - Who teams check-in to
 - Informational Guide for event
- Judges
 - Robot Inspector
 - Inspects robots and confirms if they comply to event/challenge standards
 - Safety Inspector
 - Makes sure that event is up to safety standards
 - Able to restrict teams from competing if they are in violation of safety standards
 - Technical Judge
 - Scores posters and the designs of team's robots

- Evaluates robot performance
- Scoring Judge
 - Maintains scoring of challenges
- Key Volunteers
 - Head Referee
 - Oversees all the referees of a challenge
 - Head Inspector
 - Oversees all the inspectors for a specific robot challenge
 - Head Judge
 - Oversees all technical judging
 - o Emcee
 - Master of Ceremonies and Narrator of Challenges
 - Field Supervisor
 - In charge of field maintenance
 - Volunteer Coordinator
 - Organizes and oversees volunteers for a challenge
 - Challenge Coordinator
 - Organizes and oversees volunteers for a challenge

Meals for volunteers will be covered for the duration of the event.

Want to start your own event?

If a platinum sponsor would like to make changes to one of the presented challenges or create a custom challenge that is considerably different than the presented challenges they may do so ONLY if they contact the event coordinators at least 13 months before the event.
