
If you are planning a family vacation, bring your child into the planning process. They will practice budgeting, research and reading skills, and being involved with the planning process will make them feel like they are making big decisions

How to Help Child Complete Their Homework Efficiently

- 0
- #1 Start homework within 30 minutes of arriving home
- 0
- #2 Give your child a healthy snack before they start



- 0
- #3 Set a timer for 45 minutes and start with the toughest subject first
- 0
- #4 Make sure all supplies your child needs are within arm's reach
- 0
- #5 Limit the distractions

How to Read with Your Child

1. Show the cover

- Before reading, ask them questions about the cover

2. Make it engaging

- Use separate voices and ask questions about different pictures
- Use actions

3. Test progress

- Ask questions, such as how the characters are feeling and what they think will happen next
- Encourage them to sum up what they've learned after finishing a chapter

4. Check newly acquired skills

- Whenever new words pop up, make them guess the meaning by using picture clues or words around it. Use a dictionary
- Break down sentences they do not understand and ask simple questions

5. Get feedback

- Ask your child what they like or dislike about the story
- Why?
