in darkrooms, they discovered the principle that would ultimately make low-cost home smoke detectors practical.

Statitrol introduced the first batterypowered home smoke detector in 1970, revolutionizing fire detection in small residential buildings.

An accomplished businessman himself—he was named national Small Business Person of the Year—he founded the Small Business Development Corporation in 1978 to work as an advocate for small

businesses. In 1980, he received the Society of Fire Protection Engineers' "Fire Protection Man of the Year" award in recognition of his pioneering work. (For a profile, see the August 1986 issue of the WPI Journal.)

Morgan and Pearsall, both charter members of the WPI Firesafety Board, retired from their posts after two consecutive terms. The Board was created in 1981 to serve as a source of information, advice and counsel to the fire protection engineering program.
