








MAP OF BRENTFORD

Lot's Ait remained untouched for 30 years until 2011.


SEEN IN 2017


A portion of the island was regenerated and a footbridge was added in 2013. An abandoned building still sits on the island.

Methods

On-site Analysis:

Conducted on Lot's Ait, the Kew Bridge pontoon, and surrounding area

Interviews:

Council, island stakeholders, boating, watersport, and incubator stakeholders, potential funders, and IBTC

Survey:

Distributed a boating skills survey through social media and in person


