The Cañaris and Incas **buried** their **treasures** under the *Laguna Culebrillas* to **protect** their gold from the Spaniards.


You can still visit *Laguna Culebrillas* today. Many people go **fishing** at the lake. The **locals** say that the gold **glows** at night.
