


US Teenagers Addicted to Vaping: The Cigarette Sequel

M.O.P: The Three Step Process


1. Smokerlyzer®, works like breathalyzer for alcohol

2. Measures nicotine level in the blood stream

3. Communicates level with phone app



Smokerlyzer® unlocks the app. Records the amount of nicotine present in the body.






Routes

Health Effects




Vaping can cause inflammation in the lungs which can cause pneumonia, lung obstruction and collapse, and more.
