
Debbie Lewis decided to take advantage of the Inventory time-off to fly to Las Vegas to see Elvis.

Some insurance companies are giving a 2% discount on Homeowner's Insurance policies, if a SmokeGard detector has been installed. Check with your own company, and ask about the HO216 endorsement, covering rate reduction for fire and/or burglar alarm systems. We've heard of participation by Aetna, Allstate, Central Insurance Company (an affiliate of Central Bank & Trust), and State Farm. Traveler's and Safeco do not allow the discount, apparently, but check with your own agent. He may not be aware of it unless you ask, so it's worth the effort.
